### **COVID-19 ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Due to the recent announcements by the Prime Minister in Westminster and particularly of the First Minister in Holyrood, there will need to be some adjustments to our working arrangements concerning the near future. As a result, the following will apply: **1.**Working from home wherever possible, and Mass obligation suspended for now. **2.** No travel between England and Scotland to help prevent or hinder the spread of the new mutant strain of Coronavirus 19 which has up to 70% increased transmissibility. This applies as from Monday 21<sup>st</sup> for some modes of transport, earlier for others, but certainly from **26/12/2020** in most areas of Scotland, including our own diocese. Additionally, the whole area of the diocese, is to move into Tier 4. **3.** The most direct consequence of this as far as we are concerned is the **MASS ATTENDANCE WILL BE RESTRICTED TO A MAXIMUM OF 20 PEOPLE FROM 26/12**. This will have greater consequences for the Sundays of the Holy Family 27/12/2020, the Solemnity of the Mother of God 1/1/21, the Second Sunday of Christmas 3/1/21, the Solemnity of the Epiphany (6/1/21), and The Baptism of the Lord (10/1/21). It is possible that these arrangements could last longer than this, indeed further into January. Please continue to observe the customary rules of social distancing, mask wearing, and sanitising strictly as long as the emergency lasts. You may also wish to attend the Mass during the week to spread the load.
