Short Lenten Reflection.

Based on 'The Seven Last Words of Our Lord' By: Fr Lawrence Lew O.P. The Priory Church, (The Rosary Shrine), London

The Second Words (See Lk 23:43) To the Good Thief:-*'Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'*

As Christ's first words on the cross were those of forgiveness, so His second words were to offer that forgiveness and open the doors of Paradise to who we call the 'Good Thief.' This act by Jesus intimates to us how our lives can be changed and transformed in an instant, for the spiritual action of Grace takes no time at all if we open our hearts to God's Grace and Mercy. To call on the name of Jesus, therefore is to believe in the power of God to save us through His Son.

Keeping our eyes fixed on Christ who is the truth and the life also enables us, boldly yet humbly, to face up to who we are as sinners and all that we have done. Repentance and sorrow for our sins is fundamental and necessary for receiving the forgiveness we can receive in the Sacrament of Confession and opens the treasures of Paradise to us as granted by Jesus to the 'Good Thief.' Jesus knows each and every one of us by name and loves us even with all our faults and is always ready and willing to forgive us and open the kingdom of Heaven to us. So let us take advantage of this wonderful gift, freely offered so, like the 'Good Thief' we can one day be with Him in Paradise.

Let us once again end this short meditation with the prayer the Angel of Peace taught the children of Fatima: '*My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee."*

ST JOHN OGILVIE Friday 10th March – Feast Day

Martyr was born in 1580 at Drum, near Keith. Educated a Calvinist, he went to the Low Countries and was received into the Catholic Church by Father Cornelius à Lapide. He became a Jesuit, was ordained priest in 1613 and landed in Scotland that year. In Edinburgh and Glasgow, he reconciled many to the Ancient Faith, but was betrayed, imprisoned and tortured, and finally hanged in Glasgow in 1615.
