Short Lenten Reflection.

Based on 'The Seven Last Words of Our Lord' By: Fr Lawrence Lew O.P. The Priory Church, (the Rosary Shrine), London

> The Fifth Words (Jn 19: 28) To All: **'I Thirst.'**

All of us when we say we are thirsty mean we need something to drink. Indeed, this is what the Roman executioners thought and gave Jesus vinegar to quench what they thought was human thirst. Traditionally, the Scriptures and the Saints have however spoken about thirst being the human soul thirsting for God. Psalm 63, for example says 'O God you are my God, for you I long, for you my soul is thirsting like a dry weary land without water.'

In going to the cross, Christ leads us as a shepherd leads his flock through the 'valley of the shadow of death' guiding us to the lush green pastures of Paradise (Ps 22) where He will satisfy the deepest thirst of the soul: our longing for God, for happiness and Divine love. Jesus promised that 'whoever drinks the water that I shall give him will never thirst; the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.' (Jn 4: 14)

Jesus thirsts every moment of every day for you and I, wants us to come to Him and thirsts for our love, attention and gratitude. He waits for us especially in the Eucharist at Mass or in the Tabernacle. We should never take for granted this great gift he gave to us, His living presence in the Eucharist. He asks, will you come and spend some time with me? Will we not come to church and adore Him, love Him and speak to Him who is exposed on the altar day after day. He longs for you, He misses you when you don't come close. He loves you always even when you don't feel worthy. He cries out to you **'1 thirst'**, will you satisfy that thirst?

Let us once again end this short meditation with the prayer the Angel of Peace taught the children of Fatima: 'My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.'
