Short Lenten Reflection.

Based on 'The Seven Last Words of Our Lord' By: Fr Lawrence Lew O.P. The Priory Church, (The Rosary Shrine), London

The Fourth Words (See Mt 27: 46) To God, His Father: **'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me.**'

You may well ask, with Jesus being God, the second person in the Trinity, how could He say God has forsaken Him? We must remember that Jesus was truly man as well as being truly God and on the cross He willed and lovingly chose that He share our human experience down to the very depth and dark pits of

depression that we will ever experience. Christ endures not only bodily pain but also the sufferings of the soul, psychological pain, the sense of being alone, without a loving Father or even a loving God. To think there is no God, creates a deep sadness of soul that can depress and warp a whole society. Yet, Christ lovingly chooses to suffer this sorrow with us, all of us, no matter who we are, including atheists, those abandoned by parents, those who don't experience Gods love and closeness, those who can't pray and are sorrowful as a result, those who in times of sickness, distress and grief feel God is absent and those who are faced by worldly terrors, uncertainties and heartaches who wonder where God is, etc. Can you see the profound compassion of Christ? He wills even to undergo this anguish with us, in His humanity he freely wills it; Christ really does feel as we feel sometimes abandoned by God. Through His crucifixion, Christ is now evermore there with us in our forsakenness. Cling to these words of the Lord, hold on to this bitter moment on the cross. Then, in the times you are in the depth of despair remember that Christ too endured the sense of being abandoned by God and lovingly chooses to enter into our darkness in order to make it 'as clear as day' (Ps 139) for He is Emmanuel, God with us, and His presence will remove the darkness and lead us to the light.

Let us once again end this short meditation with the prayer the Angel of Peace taught the children of Fatima: 'My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.'
