

# **Short Lenten Reflection.**

Based on 'The Seven Last Words of Our Lord' By: Fr Lawrence Lew O.P. The Priory Church, (The Rosary Shrine), London

Sixth Words: To the world 'It is Finished.' (See Jn 19: 30)

Seventh Words: To God
'Father, into your hands I commend my spirit (See Lk 23: 46)

Anyone who has been by the bedside of a dying person will watch their breathing become more laboured and faint and eventually stopping as life ceases. Just as at our creation the Spirit of God - **the Breath of Life** - is breathed into us so that we are alive, at death we become fundamentally breathless. Breath, therefore is synonymous with life. The Latin word *Spiritus* used here by St Luke essentially means breath. So, when Jesus is said to yield up His spirit, or commend it to the Father, it means He gives His breath, His life, into Gods care. Jesus's death differs from ours in one crucial respect: whereas we *lose* our life, dying either passively or unwillingly, Christ *chooses* the moment of His death. So, the words by St John 'It is finished' is indicative of a mission accomplished, a purposeful act completed.

In obedience to the Father, Christ lovingly wills to undergo the agony of the cross both in body and soul, and suffer all that we human beings can ever suffer and He actively wills to die. Why? Because God loves us despite all our sinfulness and weaknesses and wants each and every one of us to share in His eternal Kingdom. What unfathomable love, to die for us so that we may be freed from sin and eternal damnation. Imagine the agony Jesus would have suffered. Not just the pain of sin and death for one person but the pain for every person who has or ever will live!

We are about to enter into Holy Week, the most important period of the Church's year culminating in the Easter Vigil so, let us constantly keep before our eyes the cross of Jesus continually thanking Him for His great love for us, in dying for our sins and opening the gates of Heaven to us.

Let us once again end this short meditation with the prayer the Angel of Peace taught the children of Fatima: 'My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.'
