ST PHILIP NERI – MEMORIAL Friday 26th May

St Philip Neri (1515 – 1595) was born in Florence but went to Rome, aged 18, where, for 17 years as a layman, he evangelised people on the street and in their homes. He became part of a confraternity which cared for poor pilgrims and patients discharged too early from hospital. He was ordained priest, aged 35. He, and a growing number of followers, gathered each evening for prayer, music, and readings from Scripture and the Church Fathers, which was the beginning of the Oratorians. They started parish missions across Rome. He had a great sense of humour, was hugely influential, and is known as the "Third Apostle of Rome" after Saints Peter and Paul.
