Notes from The Liturgical Calendar For Scotland

St Clare (1293-1353) – was the daughter of wealthy parents in Assisi and was attracted to the life and teaching of St Francis. She spent much time with him and his group. Then in 1212 founded her own women's Franciscan group, known as the 'Poor Clares'. They lived their lives in poverty, austerity and prayer. Clare as their leader, lived at the little church of San Damiano near Assisi. Her remains are venerated in the church of Santa Chiara in the town.

St Maximilian Mary Kolbe (1894-1941) — Raymond Kolbe was cruelly deprived of his father, hanged by the Russians as a traitor. He joined the Conventual Franciscan Friars, taking the name Maximilian Maria and studied in Rome. Ordained in 1918 he returned to Poland and taught in a seminary in Krakow. He held special devotion to the Immaculate Virgin Mary and in addition to operating a radio station, published articles mainly on Marian subjects. In 1941 he was arrested by the Nazis and sent to Auschwitz. As a result of a prisoner escape, to deter further attempts, 10 others were ordered to be death starved. One of those pleaded to be exempt due to having a wife and children, so Maximilian volunteered to take his place. After 2 weeks, 9 of those had died, but Maximilian was still alive, so a guard was ordered to give him a lethal injection.

<u>The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary</u> – honours the blessedness that was her destiny, the glorification of the immaculate soul and virginal body that completely conformed her to the risen Christ. This celebration offers to the Church and to all humanity an exampler and consoling message, teaching us the fulfilment of our highest hopes. Their own future glorification is happily in store for those whom Christ has made his brothers and sisters by taking on their flesh and blood.
