<p align="center"><u>Day of Prayer for Peace - A Letter from The Bishops' Conference of Scotland</u></p> <p>This Tuesday, 7th October, is designated a day of Prayer for Peace. There will be Mass and Adoration in St Anthony's at 9-30am. The Bishops of Scotland invites all Catholics to keep Tuesday the 7th of October as a Day of Prayer for Peace. It is, of course, 2 years since the terrible massacre in Israel. And now the continuing atrocities in Gaza. Especially the Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament for a moment of prayer and to light a candle. Our world today is troubled by so many wars and conflicts. It is appropriate that we as Catholics pray individually and together on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary for the Holy Land, Gaza and Israel. Pope Leo has also asked all Catholics to pray the rosary during the month of October for peace in our world. Could I suggest the following prayer for your intentions on the 7th of October:</p> <p>God of peace and justice, We pray for the people of the Holy Land: Jew, Christian and Muslim. We pray for an end of violence and terror. We lift to you all who are fearful and hurting. We ask for wisdom and compassion for those in leadership. Above all, we ask that Jesus, the Prince of Peace, establish lasting reconciliation and justice for the Holy Land and all nations. Amen.</p>

<p align="center"><u>Notes from The Liturgical Calendar For Scotland</u></p> <p><u>Our Lady of The Rosary:</u> Is a feast, instituted in Thanksgiving for the naval victory of the Holy League Of Christian Nations led by Don John of Austria, over the ships of the Ottoman Empire in 1571 at Lepanto, off the coast of Greece. Nowadays, the feast is a special day in the month of the Holy Rosary. This prayer allows us to meditate on the mysteries of Jesus, whose life was so closely associated with Mary.</p> <p><u>St John XXIII (1881-1963).</u> Was born in Soto il Monte, Italy and ordained a priest in 1904. After 20 years working in the Diocese of Bergamo. Angelo Roncalli, worked as nuncio to Bulgaria, Turkey, and France and then became Patriarch of Venice in 1953. Despite his comparatively mature age, he was elected as Pope John the 23rd in 1958. Known for his approachable and good-humoured style, the Pope surprised many by calling the Second Vatican Council, so that 'the sacred deposit of Christian doctrine should be guarded and taught more efficaciously'. and the Church be renewed. 'Good Pope John' as he was known, died on the 3rd of June 1963, after the Council's 'First Session' had been closed.</p>
