A programme for The Children's Liturgy will be drawn up in the New Year

A Thought for Christmas by Alan Draper.

The world faces numerous major conflicts! Notably the Russia-Ukraine War, the Israel-Hamas War, alongside devastating civil wars in Sudan, Myanmar, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Thus escalating instability in the Sahel region (Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger) due to jihadist insurgencies, and crises in Afghanistan, Haiti, and Yemen. Along with significant ethnic violence in Ethiopia and internal strife in Pakistan and Ecuador, these have created widespread humanitarian challenges.

What is the response to all this conflict? It is reconciliation.

Wherever we go, we see divisions among people in families, communities, cities, countries and continents.

All these divisions are tragic reflections of our separation from God.

The newborn baby gives us the task of reconciling people with one another. So, whatever we do the main question is; "Does it lead to reconciliation among people?"

Notes From The Liturgical Calendar For Scotland

The Season Of Christmas

A favourite theme for Matthew is how Jesus fulfils Scripture. This is not as a replacement for, or a negation of what we call the Old Testament. Rather, in Jesus, the promises made in the past are once more fulfilled, but now in the person of Jesus himself. We must recognise the difficulties and trials the Holy Family faced. This is a vulnerable family in whom God's promises reached their conclusion: they did not live a charmed existence!

Mary Mother Of God: This is Our Lady's greatest title. It is fitting that we celebrate it at Christmas time. I'm. She is also our mother. Jesus shared her with us from the cross. She gained this title by saying 'yes' to God's plan. We will also gain from obeying the Will of God in our lives.

Saint Sylvester 1 (285-335) was elected Pope in 314, just after the Emperor Constantine had given Christians their freedom to practise their faith openly. Whilst being a long-serving Pope, very little is recorded of his pontificate. He sent legates to the First Council of Nicaea in 325, which condemned the Aryan heresy. This had questioned the divinity of Christ.

St Thomas Becket (1118-1170) Was born in Cheapside, London, where his father was Sheriff of London. He was found a place in the household of the Archbishop Of Canterbury, who was so impressed, recommended him to King Henry II as Lord Chancellor in 1155. He was ordained a priest the day before being consecrated Archbishop in 1162, as Henry considered him the perfect choice for controlling the church. Thomas became a staunch defender of the rights of the Church. This led to bitter conflict between himself and Henry, resulting in a period of exile. He had hardly returned after a truce had been brokered, when some Knights, interpreting the Kings displeasure, murdered him in his cathedral in 1170.
